The sign-up period for the 57 cultural and artistic courses offered by the “Casa de Porras” University Cultural Centre is now open (until 17 January), with courses commencing on the 20 January and running until March 2020. This semester the courses have been grouped into eight thematic categories.

- Health, Food and Sports
- Environment
- Heritage and the City
- Inclusion and Diversity
- Film and Audiovisual Communication

The range on offer this term is more extensive than ever, encompassing courses on contemporary dance, flamenco, tango, creative writing, theatre and drama, 3D art, robotics, photography, painting, drawing, pottery and ceramics, yoga, chi kung, hiking, agroecology, sign language, and scriptwriting, to mention just a few of the 57 courses available.

It strives to enable students to gain new skills in a challenging and engaging learning environment.
