COMPENSATION STRATEGIES } GUESSING INTELLIGENTLY

USING LINGUISTIC CLUES:

Seeking and using language-based clues in order to guess the meaning of what is heard or read in the target language, in the absence of complete knowledge of vocabulary, grammar, or other target language elements. Language-based clues may come from aspects of the target language that the learner already knows, from the learners' own language, or from another language.

USING OTHER CLUES:

Seeking and using clues that are not language-based in order to guess the meaning of what is heard or read in the target language, in the absence of complete knowledge of vocabulary, grammar, or other target language elements. Non-language clues may come from a wide variety of sources: knowledge of context, situation, text structure, personal relationships, topics, or general world knowledge.
