STRATEGY SET: Applying images and sounds

STRATEGY: Using imagery

A good way to remember what has been read in the new language is to create a mental image of it. One kind of imaging has special value in reading. It involves remembering a written item by picturing the place where it is located.

For instance, Mariette remembers new English verbs by imagining the place where they are on the page. Jill remembers the expression *Cédez le passage* (yield) by picturing the road sign where she first read it.
